

Fleeing religious persecution, resilient lewish immigrants arrive in Toronto and begin building affordable/quality housing in a growing metropolis.

SYNOPSIS

Toronto—voted one of the top 5 most liveable cities in the world When I came to Toronto there were no big buildings. There was absolutely nothing.

and renowned for its vibrant cultural diversity—was forever changed for the better when a group of resilient lewish immigrants came to Canada in the first half of the 20th century. Shelter is the inspirational story of how these brave lewish immigrants survived religious persecution in their homelands to build wildly successful real estate and land development businesses and help shape a growing metropolis by making it a refuge for all newcomers to Toronto.

Forced into entrepreneurship by prejudice and circumstance, these new Torontonians started their businesses by buying land, building homes and then reinvesting in the process. But they had a vision. They saw in the post WWII real estate boom the need for affordable, quality, rental housing and instinctively knew that high-rise apartments were the answer. From 1952 to 1975, their companies, renowned and still active developers, built over 500,000 apartment rental units across all areas of the city, winning awards and accolades and providing shelter for countless newcomers. They knew that a healthy city provided shelter for all. During that time the city grew from 1 million to 2 million people.

Shelter features exclusive interviews with celebrated visionary businessmen and their families, including: Sam Brown (The Brown Group), John H. (Jack) Daniels (The Daniels Corp.), Mendel Tenenbaum (The Tenen Group); Shirley Diamond (wife of the late Eph Diamond, Founding Partner and Chairman, Cadillac Fairview Corp); Anne Weinbaum (wife of the late Jack Weinbaum, W. J. Realty & Gonte Construction, now the Preston Group); and David and Cary Green (sons of Al and Harold Green, Greenwin group) along with the Cogan, Green, Hofstedter, Krehm, Merkur, Minz, Ross, and Rubenstein families. The film also connects with Graeme Stewart, Director, The Centre for Urban Growth and Renewal and Derek Lobo, CEO, SVN Rock Advisors Inc.

Shelter combines intimate interviews with survivors and their families, archival footage and images, and dramatic reenactments to capture what it was like for these brave people to come to a new world and build families and communities that made

Toronto better for everyone.

2021 marks the 76th year after the last inmates of Auschwitz were freed. In light of that anniversary, **Shelter** offers a story of hope, resilience and determination. **Shelter** is also a timely and important note to a future Toronto; a Toronto whose current real estate market is turning it into an unaffordable and inhospitable city for the kinds of immigrants who made it what it is today.

I've been in the worst (concentration/work) camps. Over 600 people went in and in three weeks time it was down to six and I was one of them







RON CHAPMAN

Director/Producer

Director and producer Ron Chapman is an awardwinning Toronto filmmaker. His feature documentaries have garnered acclaim worldwide and have aired on major networks and platforms. They include: Who the F**K is Arthur Fogel, featuring Lady Gaga, U2, The Police, Madonna, Rush, and key music industry insiders; The Poet of Havana, with Carlos Varela, Benicio Del Toro, Jackson Browne; and The Forbidden Shore, an in-depth exploration of Cuba's top musical artists.

Ron's latest concert film, Carlos Varela Live in Havana was released internationally in January 2021, along with a special limited edition boxed set including The Poet of Hayana, Carlos Varela Live in Hayana. and a double album of the live concert.

Shelter is one of three films Ron has produced and directed being released 2021. It will have its world premiere as the opening film of the Toronto Jewish Film Festival, June 3, 2021.



His other documentary feature From Earth to Sky, the story of seven Indigenous architects from Turtle Island, will have its world-broadcast premiere on TVO, June 21st 2021, National Indigenous Peoples Day.

Ron is currently in production on a new music documentary investigating 1969's The Toronto Rock N Roll Revival – what Rolling Stone called "the second most important event in rock history" - with John Lennon and the Plastic Ono Band, Bo Diddly, Jerry Lee Lewis, Chuck Berry, Gene Vincent, The Doors, Chicago and more, for release 2022.

Ron has had a lifetime of creative entrepreneurship, starting out as a musician, he became an artist manager, record producer, club owner, and concert promoter; and evolved to develop his own film production company, and advertising agency, where he produced and directed commercials for international brands. His album of original songs, As Worlds Collide, is on Current Records, with recent single and video "Turn Away".



PHYLLIS ELLIS

Producer/Writer

Filmmaker Phyllis Ellis is a director, actor, theatre artist and teacher with 35 years experience working in the arts here in Canada as well as in Europe, Asia, Africa, India and the U.S. Ellis's work searches the dark corners of the human condition to reveal the light. Her work addresses themes of justice, transformation, beauty and healing. Her latest film, Born To Run, is her tenth film project as director/writer/ producer.

Her critically acclaimed, award-winning feature film Toxic Beauty (2019) was selected as one of the five big idea films at Hot Docs

International Film Festival 2019, and is currently screening in over 200 theatres in the U.S. Toxic Beauty has garnered worldwide distribution.

Ellis's film About Her won the prestigious Donald Brittain award at the Canadian Screen Awards (CSAs) for Best Social Political Documentary Film. Ellis won 4 CSAs and received a nomination for best direction for her work in documentary film, series, writing and performance.

Ellis is also an Olympian who has dedicated her career to telling stories empowering women's voices around the world.

EUGENE WEIS

Editor

Eugene Weis has more than 10 years experience working as an editor on feature documentary films. His keen sense for storytelling lends itself well to the craft of editing, and his work has garnered accolades, including a Canadian Screen Award nomination for Best Editing and best editing in a feature documentary by the Canadian Cinema Editors. Selected titles include: Hitman - The David Foster Project (2020), Shelter (2021), Metamorphosis (2019), The Poet of Havana (2015), and Who the F**K is Arthur Fogel (2013).
